Middle Eastern Studies Minor

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

The minor in Middle Eastern Studies is designed to give students an introduction to the study of the modern Middle East (the Arab, Turkic, Persian, and Israeli nation states) through social science and humanities courses. (Students interested in emphasizing language, archaeology and/or ancient civilizations should investigate minors in the Department of Near Eastern Studies.)

Completed applications are accepted by the International & Area Studies Teaching Program (IASTP) office (510-642-4466, iastp@berkeley.edu, 101 Stephens Hall) beginning the third week of *instruction* and through the last day of *instruction* (not the last day of finals) during the fall and spring semesters. Applications are not accepted during the summer session. Incomplete applications will be returned unread to the applicant. The deadline to submit materials for the minor is the last day of instruction of the term immediately preceding your final term. The MES minor is open to all UCB students except MES and NES majors.

To declare the MES minor, students must:

- Have completed or be currently enrolled in one Middle East-related course at UC Berkeley; and
- Not be in their final semester of undergraduate work.

A complete MES minor application consists of:

- 1. A completed MES Minor Application Form (attached).
- 2. A completed MES Minor Program Worksheet (attached).
- 3. A current copy of your UCB transcript printed from BearFacts with your name printed on the document. Please **highlight** all courses that apply to the minor, including courses in progress and transferable credits from other institutions (community colleges, study abroad). Also, indicate which course (if any) will overlap between the minor and your major.
- 4. Copies of transcripts from colleges other than UCB **IF** course work is to be counted towards the minor. Transcripts may be unofficial. We do not have access to transcripts in the Registrar's Office. Students must request copies themselves and submit them with their applications. Please **highlight** all courses to be applied to the minor.
- 5. The "Petition for Confirmation of Minor Program Completed" (attached) signed by the student. An advisor's signature is not necessary.

To complete an MES minor, students must:

- 1. Complete one introductory lower-division course from the following list: History 12, MES 10, MES 20, NES 10.
- Complete five upper-division courses about the Middle East selected from the attached list. The five upper courses
 must be taken from at least two different departments. No more than three courses can be taken from the same
 department. Substitutions must be pre-approved by an MES Advisor.
- 3. The study of modern Middle Eastern languages is encouraged; however, there is no language requirement for the MES minor nor may language courses count toward the minor.
- 4. Complete 22 or more units of MES minor coursework within the College of L&S unit ceiling policy.
- 5. Complete at least three minor courses at UC Berkeley. Transfer courses must be approved by an advisor.
- 6. <u>ALL courses for the minor must be taken for a letter grade</u>. MES 97- 99, 197- 199 cannot be used to fulfill minor requirements.
- 7. Achieve a minimum overall GPA of 2.0 in the courses used to satisfy minor requirements.
- 8. Use no more than one course to satisfy requirements for both a major and a minor.

Before submitting applications, students must:

Have their applications reviewed by an academic staff advisor. Bring your **complete** application to the IASTP Office in 101 Stephens Hall. Applicants who meet the above criteria are eligible for admission to the minor. Confirmation of your admission will be sent within fifteen working days of submitting your complete application. Once admitted, minors are required to contact by an academic staff advisor at least once each semester to get approval for any changes to their program. The College of L&S will be notified of minor completion approximately four weeks after the final minor course has been completed.
